In Memory of Anne Castellan - (elected President of DVSA for 2011)

Anne P. Castellan, 69, Long Time Employee of Sun Oil Co. Resident of Bryn Mawr, died January 13, 2011, at Bryn Mawr Hospital. The cause of death was ovarian cancer. Born January 3, 1942, in Lancaster, Anne grew up in Delaware County attending Nether Providence High School and was Valedictorian of its Class of 1959. After graduating Phi Beta Kappa from Trinity College, Washington, DC, Anne joined Sun Oil Company (later Sun) where she had a 32-year career that culminated in her being appointed the first Vice President of Information Systems at the company. During her years at Sun, Anne reengineered production control and automation for the Refining Division, championed the implementation of a company-wide 4000+ PC network, consolidated all company mainframe data centers and led from scratch the start-up of the data centers for the SunGard Disaster Recovery Services subsidiary that helped establish that new market. In 1993, she was a nominee for Information Week's Chief of the Year recognition. During her tenure with Sun, Anne served on the American Petroleum Institute's Information Systems Executive Committee; earned an MBA at the University of Dallas, and attended Harvard Business School's Management Development Program. After retiring from Sun in 1995, Anne served as Interim Manager of the Vanguard Corporate Systems Department and led their Systems Y2K Assessment Project. Over the years Anne volunteered service to many organizations and charities including serving on the board of trustees for Pierce College and Philadelphia Elwyn Institute and chairing the board of trustees for the Country Day School of the Sacred Heart in Bryn Mawr. As a volunteer with the Executive Service Corps of the Delaware Valley, she provided pro bono consulting for many other charitable groups. Anne was active in her local parish in Bryn Mawr and in tutoring and fund raising for inner city schools.
